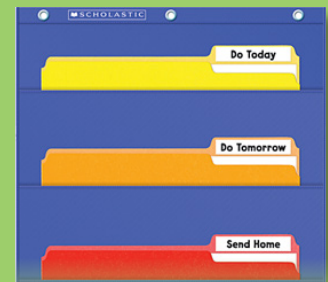
That Are Just Your Style
